Happy New Year. Not only is this an appropriate greeting as the turn the page on the Church calendar entering Advent, but it is also the prefect greeting as we turn the page to 2024.

The season of Advent has concluded, and by the time you read this the festivities of Christmas will be in the rear-view mirror. As we turn the page to 2024, we are met with the season of Epiphany.

"Epiphany" comes from a Greek word that means "to reveal." Today, if someone says, "I had an epiphany," he means he had some extremely important, life-changing revelation. Within the Church Year, that is the purpose of the season of Epiphany—to reveal important truths about Jesus Christ, truths that will indeed change your life.

For most of his adult life, Jesus was known simply as Mary's son. He followed his adoptive father, Joseph, into the carpentry business. People in his hometown of Nazareth probably thought of Jesus as a very nice man—hardworking, honest, a role model for others. (That is still how many think of Jesus today.) But around the age of thirty, the fuller truth about Jesus began to be revealed: his person, his power, his purpose. It started with Jesus standing in a river with John the Baptist. The biggest epiphany took place at a mountain, where select followers saw Jesus shining



brighter than the sun. All these epiphanies—all these revelations about Jesus—changed the lives of everyone around him. In this season of Epiphany, as we follow Jesus from the river to the mountain, may they change us too.

CHRIST IN THE OLD TESTAMENT: INTRODUCTION

The Old Testament is a long and multifaceted collection of writings. As theologically conservative Christians, we view it as foundational to our faith - we quote it, read it, and even pray portions of it (particularly the Psalms). However, the fact remains that, despite its status as God's Divine Word, the Old Testament is shrouded in mystery for many faithful Christians, and is often poorly-understood. It raises many difficult questions: What are we to make of the bloodshed? What about the laws in Leviticus? How do we even begin to make sense of baffling Books like Ecclesiastes and Ezekiel? How do the Jewish people relate to Christ and the Church today?

This article is the introduction to a series on how to interpret the Old Testament. This series will have many parts. The aim is to tackle some of the difficult questions people often ask (such as the above), but the primary goal is to answer the question: What am I supposed to get out of the Old Testament? The answer is: Jesus Himself. Christ says that all of Scripture testifies about Him (John 5:39; Luke 24:25-27); this article series will take Him at His word, and attempt to show how Jesus Christ permeates every page of the Old Testament. This series will make some use of a Bible study titled The Messiah: Revealing Jesus in the Old Testament (Concordia Publishing House, 2022). Other sources will also be used.

It is my hope and prayer to address some of the challenges Christians face when interpreting the Old Testament, and to show that these sacred Writings are saturated with Gospel hope, and the work of our Savior Jesus. If you have any questions about the OT which trouble or confuse you, feel free to send them my way; I will add them to the queue, and do my best to address them in this series. I pray that many of you will follow this series, and use it as an opportunity to open your Bible and dig into these holy Words. Hope awaits!



First Sunday after Epiphany - Baptism of Our Lord

January 7, 2024

FROM THE RIVER TO THE MOUNTAIN IT BEGINS WITH BAPTISM

(The Baptism of Our Lord)

- **Isaiah 49:1-6** Through the pen of the prophet Isaiah, the Messiah himself speaks, telling us of the work he would do when he was anointed at his baptism.
- Romans 6:1-11 St. Paul connects our baptism to Christ, and he discusses the results of that connection in our lives.
- Mark 1:4-11 Jesus public ministry begins with the anointing he received in his baptism.

Second Sunday after Epiphany

January 14, 2024

FROM THE RIVER TO THE MOUNTAIN THE KINDNESS IN HIS CALLING

- **1 Samuel 3:1-10** At a time in history when the word of the LORD was rare, the LORD shows kindness to the boy Samuel by calling to him.
- **2 Thessalonians 2:13-17** God called us to faith through the gospel, not because of any merit or worthiness in us, but entirely because of his grace and kindness.
- **John 1:43-51** Jesus proves to Nathanael that he knows absolutely everything about us. In kindness, Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to follow him.

Third Sunday after Epiphany

January 21, 2024

FROM THE RIVER TO THE MOUNTAIN COMMITTED TO A LOFTY CHARGE

- Jonah 3:1-5,10 The reluctant Jonah had been given the lofty charge of proclaiming a message from the LORD to the people of Nineveh.
- **2 Corinthians 5:14-21** Christ has committed to us, as his ambassadors, the message of reconciliation.
- **Mark 1:14-20** When Jesus gave Simon and Andrew the lofty charge of fishing for people, they left everything else behind.

Fourth Sunday after Epiphany

January 28, 2024

FROM THE RIVER TO THE MOUNTAIN ABSOLUTE AUTHORITY

- Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Moses prophesies that the LORD would raise up another prophet
 who would speak with all the authority of God himself.
- **Hebrews 3:1-6** As great as Moses was, Jesus is worthy of infinitely greater honor. For only Jesus has absolute authority.
- Mark 1:21-28 Jesus demonstrates absolute authority. Even his enemies, the demons, have to obey him.

Cast out our sin, and enter in,


Be born in us today.

The Prince of Peace their King,


And the whole world send back the song
